
TRUMANSBURG ROTARY MEETING MINUTES FOR October 5th, 2023

- ♣ President Durand started the meeting early!!
- ♣ President Durand announced Becky Gardinia, from the Christmas Bureau, as our speaker for the evening.
- ♣ Becky stated that the Christmas Bureau has been in business for 75 years and a school nurse from Trumansburg started it while seeing children who needed help. Over the years it has grown. It is a strictly volunteer organization. "Neighbors Helping Neighbors". In order to qualify for assistance, you must go to the Trumansburg Schools and be under 18 years of age. Covid stopped a lot of the "festive" part of the program. All the applicants are kept anonymous. Letters are sent out to ask for shopping or donations. The average cost per child is \$100, The Christmas Bureau also hands out "Goodie Bags" to Seniors. Last year the Bureau helped 134 children, 107 adults, and 85 Seniors with bags. Families must apply and anyone is welcome. The families got 5 bags of food. If enough food was not donated, the rest would be bought at the ShurSave. The Trumansburg Community was VERY generous during Covid that no donations were solicited. The Bureau also gives out 2 scholarships between \$750-\$1,000 to senior students who show potential in public service. There is also a fund for school nurses who might see students in need of shoes, boots, coats, etc. The drop off for donations and gifts is December 9th.
- → President Durand gave Peggy the tickets for the Supermarket Sweeps and he also showed us the posters that will be used to advertise the Sweeps. Shelly volunteered to make us signup sheets for selling the tickets at the ShurSave.
- ♣ There will be no speaker next week.


