- ✚ Then the Trumansburg Department of Public Works Supervisor, Dusty VanDerzee, gave a presentation. Dusty has been the Village Supervisor for over 6 years. Some of the jobs that the department has worked on recently are the sidewalks to the Trumansburg Conservatory. They did this with the help of people from Manpower. There have been only 2 water main breaks this season. They have fixed up the salt shed, installed a new driveway to the water tower, the sewer manholes were tinned so there would be no ground water infiltration and GIS Mapping for all shutoff valves in the village so easy to find in the event of an emergency to shut them off. Dusty also raises and lowers the flags in the Village as directed by either the Governor or President. That includes the Rotary Island flag. Dusty also stated that around 150,000 gallons of water a day is used by the Village and there are monitors that will let them know if there is an excess amount used at any one time.

- ✚ Frank also announced that RYLA is ready to go and now working with the school to find two candidates to go.
- ✚ Frank also stated that the Duck Race tickets will be ready by next week so we should be prepared to start selling them as the race is not that far off.
