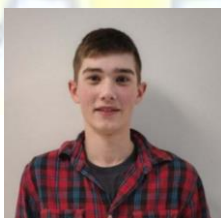




TRUMANSBURG ROTARY MEETING MINUTES FOR March 14, 2024

exemplifies our global reach in promoting peace and understanding.



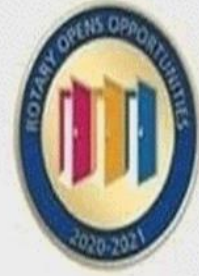
